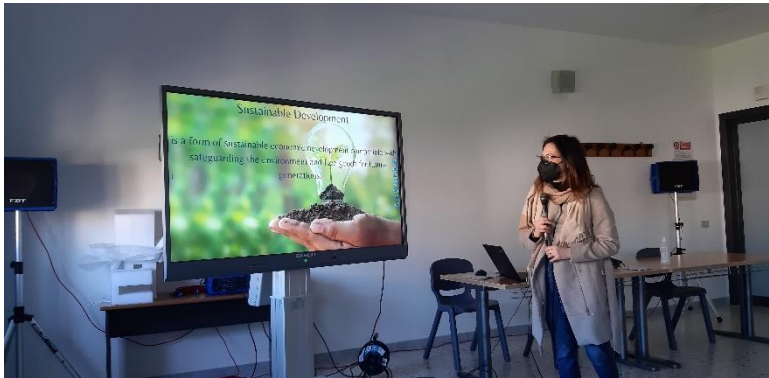


REPORT FROM 2nd PROJECT MEETING IN BOSA, SARDINIA, ITALY TUESDAY 22nd MARCH 2022



Tuesday started as calmly as any other day. My host mom woke me up at 7:30, but I was already awake because I had a nest with birds next to the window. I always had a choice of a few things for breakfast for example toast with

chocolate spread or pan cakes with jam but that day I had a bit of everything because I thought it would be fine to try all.

Around 8:15 we went to Daisy (which is a local coffee shop), where we met up with the rest of our group. The others had breakfast there, but me not because I have already had breakfast before. It is a big difference – we always eat breakfast at home in the Czech Republic.

So at 8:55, at the last moment, our hosts realized that we were supposed to be at school for a programme at 9, so the Italians started make us hurry up. When we got to school we had to present our vaccination certificate as any other day.



After that we went to sit in the classroom where we had a meeting with all the participating countries, but as always we were the first ones there because we were the only ones on time. The first presentation of the day was by a teacher **Rita Mele on tourism as an opportunity for sustainability and equitable development**, this presentation was nicely done and quite understandable. There was a break after this lecture with various sweets, I liked the pizza dough pancakes the most. Then the programme continued. **The Swedish team had their presentation on sustainable energy** - this presentation was a bit difficult for me

but the graphics were very nice.



When this presentation was finished, my host and her friends who were hosting the rest of the Czechs took us to a restaurant for lunch.

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The restaurant was very nice, but the menus were only in Italian, which meant we had something we didn't even know what it would be like. In the end, we all picked a tasty meal, and **we all had panini**. We all ate well and headed towards Blue Star (it's a room full of vending machines), we spent at least 1 hour there every day but none of us ever bought anything there.



And at 3 p.m., the sightseeing of the city started. Actually, the city itself wasn't very nice except for the beautiful colours on the buildings. **The colours were**



totally vibrant, but I also liked it because of the plants. They had pretty flowering plants growing all over the buildings, the roads, the poles but also around the forgotten bicycles, it was absolutely magical. The

streets were very narrow and winding up and down. It was like a maze for us.

We also stopped at the museum along the way. This museum showed us the way of life in Sardinia in the 18th century. **The museum was called Casa Deriu.** It was a small palace with all the equipment.

We went to **the castle Malaspina** which was closed too, but we enjoyed the view of the city from the castle.
