REPORT FROM 3rd PROJECT MEETING IN BRNO, CZECH REPUBLIC WEDNESDAY 16th MARCH 2022



On Wednesday we continued to work on learning about **the work of a tour guide, but this time in the city centre of Brno.** In the morning we met at the school and took a tram together to the city centre where we the teachers were

waiting for us at the main square and we started a game – a sort of a hunt in international teams to explore the sights of Brno.

At 4 p.m. everyone went home to their host families and had a programme with their hosts. Some met in town centre or had other activities.
