Cathedral of Santa Maria – La Seu

It was built in 1230 and is one of the biggest **Gothic cathedrals** in Europe. It is made of golden-brown sandstone and has elements of Arabic architecture.



Santa Clara de Palma



A

monastery located in the Old Town of Palma. It was founded by nuns of the Franciscan order. There are tombs of Gothic origin and a statue of Saint Clare of Assisi near the altar.

Iglesia de Mansion in Mallorca

This church stands on the site of an old Jewish synagogue. The most famous features are the carved portals showing Saint Ignatius of Loyola and Saint Francis Xavier


Sant Francesc Square and Basilica

Sant Francesc A square in the centre of Palma with buildings from the 18th century. In the middle of the square is the Basilica Sant Francesc, built in the 13th century in Gothic style.

Iglesia de Santa Eulàlia



One of the oldest churches on Mallorca. It is in Gothic style and was built on the site of a Muslim mosque. Records of its construction date back to 1236.



Can Forteza Rey



A five-story residential building in modern Art Nouveau style. The design was inspired by Gaudí's works.

Plaza Mayor

A square in the historic centre of Mallorca with colourful buildings full of shops and restaurants. During summer, there are craft markets.



Old Town Hall

A historic Baroque building with a giant olive tree in front of it.
