Arucas - church of San Juan Batista

At the foot of the hills with plantations of sugar cane and banana trees lies this third largest city on the island of Gran Canaria. One of the great attractions of this old city is the neo-Gothic construction of the great black church of San Juan Batista. Its construction took over half a century from the year 1909 to the 1970s. It is the leading architectural and social monument in the village. It was built entirely in Arucas by stones by local masters and dates back to 1909. In addition to the wealth of carved stone columns and column heads, there are also some beautiful stained-glass windows. Arucas is very nice and architecturally significant on the Canary Islands.





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
